
We are grateful for Joan's generous commitment to our mission and her willingness to act as family research facilitator. Please contact us for more information.

LANDSCAPING PROGRESS AND PLANS

If you have visited the cemeteries recently, we know you are as pleased as we are about their beautiful and respectful appearance. Our landscapers (D & S Landscaping) have cleaned, trimmed, and maintained our cemeteries throughout 2006 and 2007. With your continued support, we plan to be able to continue this maintenance in the future. Because we are a nonprofit organization, all charitable contributions must be made to our organization's general funds and used for general cemetery maintenance; no contributions may be made for work on any specific graves.

While most of you have expressed satisfaction and gratitude for the improvement you have seen at the Hebrew Fraternity Cemetery and the Congregation Shaarey Tefiloh Cemetery, some of you have expressed disappointment at the neglect and overgrowth you have seen at other cemeteries, and some of you have asked us to get involved in the care of these cemeteries too. We share your concerns about the conditions of *all* cemeteries, and we are eager to help if we can.

However, we are able to provide maintenance only at cemeteries that have authorized us to do so. While we are interested in hearing about neglect at other cemeteries and are willing to entertain requests to help them, we require authorization from the cemetery's owner and financial support from the families of those interred there before we can initiate any action. Please contact us to discuss any such requests.
