Treasurer's Message

ur organization was created to raise funds to support and maintain the cemeteries owned by Congregation Shaarey Tefiloh — a project based on the realization that these cemeteries lacked sufficient funds to meet anticipated future expenses. Although this remains our primary

mission, we have also embarked on other related projects.

Many of you have come to our cemeteries to find information about your ancestors. Not only do cemetery monuments provide the names of one's ancestors and their dates of birth and death, but often they contain other interesting and valuable information. More often than not, the relevant information is in Hebrew, and we have assisted those who require translations of the Hebrew inscriptions into English. We have thereby helped many of you trace your roots and connect with your relatives. We have also provided assistance to both individuals and groups searching for graves of their relatives. Our interest in cemeteries is not limited to the Shaarey Tefiloh cemeteries. Whenever asked for assistance, we help people locate graves at other cemeteries, too.

Our involvement during the past year in helping Congregation Shaarey Tefiloh distribute memorial plaques to family members who wanted them provided yet another opportunity to help many of you connect with your ancestors — an opportunity that enabled both you and us to honor and remember them in a very special way. My cousin Mark Chazin has placed the memorial plaques of our grandparents, Cantor Hirsch L. Chazin and Dora Chazin, on the memorial board of the Jewish Community Center of Long Beach Island, where many former Perth Amboy residents can see them and where other members of his family are also honored.



Most were picked up at several scheduled events, and many were mailed to family members living at a distance — including several to international destinations. We are very grateful to volunteers Marilyn Millet Goldberg, Sandra Deitel, and Karen Koch for donating their time and effort to help with this project. We were glad we were able to assist the synagogue leaders with this enormous project.

Family members expressed a wide variety of emotions and reactions to these plaques. Most people described and demonstrated a deep emotional attachment to these plaques because they represented a convenient and portable way to honor the memories of our loved ones and a very visible and tangible way to keep them close. Some people have already found a convenient place to display these plaques --- on another organization's memorial board or in a personal display at home — and others




