President's Message

s we begin which involve both anticipated and the new year (5777), we face new challenges and new oppor-

tunities. We have worked hard to raise funds, interest, and awareness – but we have a lot more work to do. We remain inspired and encouraged by our growing list of supporters, and we will need your involvement and contributions even more in the future.

We have learned a great deal by attending national Jewish cemetery conferences, and we have shared some of this information with you in past issues of our newsletter. We remain mindful of what we have learned from cemetery experts about costs and responsibilities. As we have stated previously, very few people understand the complexity of cemetery management and main-

tenance, and most people grossly underestimate the true costs involved. Most managers of cemeteries owned by synagogues and fraternal lodges underestimate the longterm expenses and fail to prepare adequately for them. The futures of such cemeteries eventually become bleak, and many of them face abandonment. Cemetery management requires much more than selling plots, arranging burials, mowing grass, trimming weeds, planting verdure, and keeping records — all of

unanticipated expenses. Stan Kaplan (former chair of the

Jewish Cemetery Association of North America and current executive director of the Jewish Cemetery Association of Massachusetts) has stated "By the time a cemetery is full, it should have 20 times its annual operating expenses in an endowment - but few do." Gary Katz (past president and current vice president of New York's Community Alliance for Jewish-Affiliated Cemeteries) has predicted that "Based on current practices, substantially all Jewish cemeteries will be unable to pay for their upkeep within 25 to 50 years after their last grave is sold." Many cemeteries have formed alliances to face the future together, but — unfortunately — most financially healthy cemeteries do not become interested in this problem until

their funds have become depleted.

On Yom Kippur, we recited the long confession Al Chet. Among the sins we were called upon to atone for are those committed bi-tzorus avin. The literal translation is "with a begrudging eye," and the commentary explains that it refers to one who does not give generously to charity. As we all resolved to be more generous, our Yom Kippur Yizkor service provided us with a


