Bardin Levavy

s our organization's secretary and one of its founders, Bardin Levavy (known as "Bardy" to his many friends) played a major role in our organization from our inception in 2005 until his death this year. His wisdom and legal knowledge guided us, and his witty humor entertained us — regularly and consistently.

He had many close friends — collected from every stage of his life — including his childhood in Perth Amboy

and his alma maters Rutgers Preparatory School, Johns Hopkins University, and Harvard Law School. Those who knew him well considered him an aficionado of music, literature, and baseball, as well as a gifted wordsmith and a keen student of history.

Somewhat less well known was the fact that he was a direct descendant of the Vilna Gaon (the great genius of Vilnius) – through his maternal grandfather, Charles Bardin — and was a distant relative of many who are interred in our cemeteries. Bardy's great-grandfather, Kalman Bardin, was one of the founders of the first Orthodox congregation in Rochester, NY (Beth Israel Congregation), where he served as cantor and shochet. Bardy's family was an integral part of the Perth Amboy Jewish Community for many years. Those who grew up in Perth Amboy remember shopping for many gifts in Sarah Bardin's Gift Shop, and many of us had Bardy's aunt, Gladys Bardin, as a 6th grade teacher in the Perth Amboy Grammar School. Members of Congregation Shaarey Tefiloh surely remember Bardy's father, Zvi Levavy, chanting the Haftarah annually on Yom Kippur — an honor he had earned and deserved.

Bardy is survived by his wife, Sue-Ellen, and his children, Rafi and Sara. His death is a loss to all of us and a loss to our organization, and we will all miss him.

a head cover too. All tours are followed by an
optional visit to a local, casual restaurant for
continued socializing with old friends.

Although all tours are free, advance registration is recommended so that we can notify you of any weather-related cancellations and can locate any family graves of special interest to you. If you can't visit in person, we will be glad to visit for you and will place stones on the graves for you too.

10th Annual Conference of The Jewish Cemetery Association of North America – June 2018


