
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

We also came together as a community to repair the recently **vandalized cemetery monuments**, all of which were quickly restored as a result of our efforts.

Despite our tremendous pride in our accomplishments thus far, we acknowledge that fundraising for cemetery maintenance remains the cornerstone of our existence and recognize that we still have a very long way to go to accomplish our goal of raising enough funds to maintain these cemeteries forever. We believe that the success of our mission depends on our ability to attract people who feel the same sense of community and generosity that has inspired us to come together to save our cemeteries. LANDSCAPING PROGRESS AND PLANS

If you have visited the cemeteries recently, you will have noticed that our landscapers (D & S Landscaping) have cleaned, trimmed, and maintained the cemeteries beautifully throughout 2006. We know that you were as pleased as we were because so many of you expressed compliments and gratitude. Following our plans to maintain the cemeteries in this respectful manner, we have renewed our contract with D & S Landscaping throughout 2007.

It is still our intention to respect all plantings and stones purchased by the deceased and their families, and we have no plans to modify any existing structures. Because we are a nonprofit organization, all charitable contributions must be made to our organization's general funds and must be used for general cemetery maintenance; no contributions may be made for work on any specific graves. Anyone wishing to arrange for repairs or maintenance on specific graves should make private arrangements and may directly contact D & S Landscaping (732-549-6387) for this purpose.

CEMETERY TOURS



he success and popularity of our Cemetery Tours, which began in March 2006, continues. Many of you have taken advantage of these tours to visit the graves of your loved ones and to honor the memory of the Perth Amboy Jewish Community as well as to observe the current condition of the cemeteries and our progress in restoring and maintaining them. Some of you have learned about these tours through newspaper articles and television programs covering them. At each tour we provide historical information about the cemeteries, those interred there, and the community in which they lived. We also include a few prayers to enhance our memorial tribute and follow each tour with a visit to a local restaurant to extend our reminiscing and socializing. The tours are free, and all are welcome and invited to attend. Many tour attendees have returned frequently, as a means of honoring and remembering deceased relatives and reminiscing with old friends.

May 13 (Mother's Day) July 8 August 5 September 2 October 14

All tours begin at 12:00 noon at the Hebrew Fraternity Cemetery entry gate on New Brunswick Avenue in Hopelawn. After a 1-hour tour of the Hebrew Fraternity Cemetery, we will drive to the Congregation Shaarey Tefiloh Cemetery on Florida Grove Road and Bingle Street for a 1-hour tour of that cemetery. WEAR VERY COMFORTABLE CLOTHES AND SHOES. All tours will be followed by a visit to a local, casual restaurant.

For those who are unable to attend a scheduled group tour, especially those who live at a distance and plan to visit this area at another time, we will be happy to arrange for a private tour at another time. Please contact us to make such arrangements.
