PERTH AMBOY JEWISH COMMUNITY HISTORY BOOK AN UPDATE FROM AUTHOR ROBERT SPECTOR

As many of you know, several of us have volunteered to work on a labor of love: a book about the history of Jewish people in Perth Amboy. This book is not about nostalgia; not an elegy for the "good old days". Rather it is the story of a proud, vibrant community and the contributions that we made to Perth Amboy. It's about the shopkeepers and the synagogues; the public schools and the Hebrew Schools; dances at the "Y" and prayers at the cemeteries; good friends and lasting memories.

With all due respect to Thornton Wilder, this book is our community's version of "Our Town," with all the joys and sorrows; the mundane and the miraculous.

My most recent book, "The Mom & Pop Store," which is part memoir, brought me back to growing up in Perth Amboy and the influence it had on my life, particularly working in my parents' butcher shop in the Farmers' Market on Smith and Elm. Describing downtown Perth Amboy, I wrote:

Although Smith Street, the seven-block- long main shopping drag in Perth Amboy, had the occasional national chain — F. W. Woolworth, Kresge, Thom McAn shoes — what I remember best are the vast array of small shops....Roth's Furniture, Littman's Jewelers, Schlesinger's School Supplies, Plaid 'n' Tweed clothes, Roy's Young Men's Shop, Allyn's Shoes, the Kotton Shop, and others were not just stores or centers of consumption. These small-business men and women were the parents of friends and classmates; representatives of our community; members of our churches, synagogues, and Parent-Teacher Associations; and sponsors of our Little League teams.

This book is **your** story. It will reflect our collective experience growing up in Perth Amboy – or in the surrounding area --- and how it formed the people we have become. It was a Golden Age; a little bit of Camelot on the Raritan. This book is for your children, grand-children, and great-grandchildren, who one day will want to know about your roots—**their** roots—and what made **your** Jewish community in Perth Amboy so special. This is your gift to them.

I am excited about finishing this labor of love and sharing it with you. We expect it to be in print and available for distribution by December 2011 – in time for Chanukah gifts. Please join us in making the dream of this book a reality. If you haven't already sent a donation or sponsored a Family Tribute Page, we hope you will – and we hope you will purchase enough copies of this treasure to place one on the coffee table of each of your children and grandchildren – as well as one on your own coffee table, of course.
