## **SECRETARY'S MESSAGE**

**H**ow many of us remember Gary Mandel? He was my contemporary and probably was known to many of you.

Gary died of a brain tumor in 1956. I no longer remember whether it was shortly before his Bar Mitzvah or just after it. He left his parents and an older sister, Gail. I knew him but we weren't close; I re-

member him being particularly friendly with Sandy Katz.

Gary is gone. Who remembers him?

I didn't. Not until I went on one of our cemetery tours three years ago. I was walking around the New Brunswick Avenue cemetery seeing who was there when I saw Gary. The stone is small but it's clear and it and Gary's grave have been maintained ... and when I saw



it, Gary came to mind, clearly focused. A memory of my youth.

Writers as diverse as Elie Wiesel and Marcel Proust have written extensively on memory and its importance. As I age, I come to understand more fully Dryden's line, "All mortal things are subject to decay" and remind myself that a generation or two from now, even among those of us who leave grandchildren or greatgrandchildren, the memory of us will have all but vanished. What will keep us alive then are our books and our tombstones.

Friends' mission is to preserve a portion of that memory and to slow that decay. It's a mission which requires only two ingredients in order to succeed – dedica-

If you can't visit in person, we will be glad to visit for you and will place stones on the graves for you too.

# **CEMETERY COSTS SHOCK EVERYONE**

We received many comments from readers in response to the article about cemetery costs in our Fall 2013 newsletter — confirming the article's statement about how surprised – even shocked – most people are about the true costs of running a cemetery. Since publication of our Fall 2013 newsletter, we have read several similar articles about the widespread and increasing cemetery neglect and abandonment that result from insufficient cemetery funds problems that are certainly not limited to Jewish cemeteries. Among these articles was a very informative one written by Julie Wiener (a features writer for Jewish Telegraphic Agency) and published in many Jewish weekly newspapers (Jewish Voice, Jan. 22, 2014), quoting several Jewish cemetery authorities. According to Stan Kaplan (chair of the Jewish Cemetery Association of North America and executive director of the Jewish Cemetery Association of Massachusetts), "By the time a cemetery is full, it should have 20 times its annual operating expenses in an endowment – but few do." Gary Katz (president of New York's Community Association for Jewish At-Risk Cemeteries) predicted that "Based on current practices, substantially all Jewish cemeteries will be unable to pay for their upkeep within 25 to 50 years after their last grave is sold." While many cemeteries have formed alliances to face the future together, it is unfortunate that most financially healthy cemeteries do not become interested in this problem until their funds have become depleted. We hope this information will remind our readers to be as generous as possible.


