President's Message

s l've explained in previous newsletters, I have learned a lot about Jewish cemeteries by attending national and international conferences and talking to cemetery leaders from all over North America. We face many of the same problems and

challenges, and we all benefit from sharing our knowledge and experience. To learn even more, I plan to attend the 10th Annual Jewish Cemetery Association of North America (JCANA) Conference in Boston in June.

This year's conference will include sessions on cemetery preservation, fundraising, prudent investing, and liability issues. We will also have a chance to visit several historic cemeteries in the Boston area. Some of my relatives are buried there, and you may be surprised to learn that some of yours might be there too.

JCANA promotes a Code of Ethics as a guide for its members and for all cemetery managers, encouraging ethical business, regulatory, and religious standards. These include ensuring accurate burial records at all times, maintaining dignified burial ground conditions, providing for cemetery preservation and continuity in perpetuity, managing the financial affairs of the cemetery with integrity and fiduciary trust, and cultivating endowment funds consistent with long-term funding needs of cemetery continuity. These are indeed worthy standards for all cemetery owners and managers.

Very few people appreciate the complexity of cemetery ownership, management, and maintenance, and most underestimate the true costs involved, especially long-term. This was true in the early 20th century and is still true today.

We have devoted a great amount of time and effort to our mission raising awareness, interest, and funds - and we remain humbled by the immensity of the task still ahead of us. After visiting the Hebrew Fraternity Cemetery, we will drive to the Congregation Shaarey Tefiloh Cemetery and the Congregation Beth Mordecai Cemetery on Florida Grove Road. WEAR VERY COMFORTABLE CLOTHES AND SHOES — appropriate for standing and walking outdoors for 2 hours, and please wear a head cover too. All tours are followed by an optional visit to a local, casual restaurant for continued socializing with old friends.

Although all tours are free, advance registration is recommended so that we can notify you of any weather-related cancellations and can locate any family graves of special interest to you. If you can't visit in person, we will be glad to visit for you and will place stones on the graves for you too.




