JOAN KATES COWLAN: "I grew up in the Elmora section of Elizabeth and remember walking to and from school along "the highway" (North Avenue). Although I had very few Jewish classmates at Elmora School #12, Elizabeth had a very large Jewish population and several synagogues and religious schools. My family belonged to Congregation B'nai Israel, which was led by Rabbi Gershon Chertoff and Cantor Morris Schorr. I can vividly remember reciting Aleinu when our Junior Congregation led a Shabbat service there. Cantor Schorr is buried in the B'nai Israel

Cemetery on McClellan Street on the border of Elizabeth and Newark."



BRIAN GOLDSMITH: "Plainfield was the center of economic and social activity for nearly all of the surrounding communities, including North Plainfield, where I grew up. We all shopped in downtown Plainfield --- at Tepper's, Rosenbaum's, Bamberger's, and many small retail stores. Of Plainfield's four synagogues, only Temple Shalom had its own religious school, so most of us received our Jewish education at the Plainfield Hebrew Institute, which was a community Hebrew

school not affiliated with any synagogue. My friends and classmates at the Plainfield Hebrew Institute and at the Plainfield Jewish Community Center Day Camp were from Plainfield and all of the surrounding communities (North and South Plainfield, Watchung, Berkeley Heights, Dunellen, Piscataway, Scotch Plains, Green Brook, Warren Township, and Middlesex). I have some really wonderful memories of growing up in this community!"



CAROL LEVINE ROBERTS: "I first attended services at Temple B'nai Jeshurun on High Street in Newark when my grandparents took me. I later attended religious school there and stayed through confirmation. Many of my school classmates were also my classmates at Columbia High School in Maplewood. In high school I became very active in the Temple youth group and formed great friendships. Ely Pilchik and Barry Greene were our rabbis. The majestic voice of Cantor Norman

Summers filled the high domed ceiling of the temple. My wedding in 1967 was one of the last to take place in the Newark facility before the congregation relocated to Short Hills."



ALLAN LUBIN: "I loved growing up in Perth Amboy. My friends and I practically lived in the YMHA, playing basketball, ping pong tournaments, and learning to swim, all under the kind supervision of beloved staff member Hecky Plain. It was at the YMHA that I attended my first dance and enjoyed participating in plays as well. When I think of Perth Amboy, I also recall the wonderful camaraderie in my neighborhood among many of our Jewish and Christian neighbors of all ethnicities.

We loved sports, but we also knew the value of studying hard so we could attend college and pursue other dreams."



PHYLLIS ORGEL FEINBLUM: "I have so many good memories of growing up in Elizabeth: shopping on Broad Street, Elizabeth Avenue, and Elmora Avenue. -- and knowing the owners of so many of the stores; going to dances, clubs, and swimming at the Y; meeting my friends there and being part of the inter-city youth council of teens from the Jewish Ys in Perth Amboy, Elizabeth, Bayonne and Somerville; working as a counselor at the Y day camp, Camp Y-HO-CA. What a great place to grow up and be a teen!"

- Inquiring about any individual cemetery plots












