Noam Kamara: My interest in our cemeteries and my appreciation for what they represent has grown since I was a child. During several years as a student in Elizabeth, I became especially interested in the McClellan Street cemeteries that serve as the final resting

places for the great Jewish communities of Elizabeth, Newark, and the surrounding areas. I feel a personal connection to these areas as well, since my great-great-great-grandfather arrived in New Jersey from Poland in 1905, settled in Paterson, and lived in Newark for a period of time. We are indebted to those who built the communities that our cemeteries now represent, and we must preserve these cemeteries to honor them.
